Dear Church Family

What a wonderful service we had on 21st March! It was a celebration for the lifting of the suspension that had been in place since 2006. This means that any Incumbents you have had since that date were Priests in Charge. I began my post here as Priest in Charge but in addition to that my post was temporary. It was created as such due to the new housing estate being built at South Marston. I started initially on a 3 year









contract that was extended to 6 years. Last year after a meeting with Archdeacon Christopher it was decided that the house building was slowing down and there was no need to keep my post temporary. It was decided to begin the process of lifting the suspension and making my position open ended as Rector. After consultation with our PCCs, our Patrons and Bishop's staff the suspension was lifted and I was licensed at the service on 21st March.

It was a celebration for all of us as there are many benefits for our churches as well as me. I truly love it here and feel incredibly blessed to have such loving and supportive congregations. To know that my temporary status has been lifted gives me and my family a real sense of stability and rootedness, I may even add some colour to my white walls now!

I want to thank everyone who came to the service to celebrate there were just under 80 of us! A special thank you goes to all involved behind the scenes in planning and putting on the service; so many it's impossible to name but I do want to name a few. Firstly, Georgina our administrator who works so hard for us but who was a complete trooper as it took a great deal of planning. Secondly Karl who manned the sound desk and made sure me, the readers, intercessors, the Bishop and the Archdeacon were all heard clearly. Thirdly to my lovely Church Wardens who took pride of place roles in the service. To Pat and Ray who have been vergers at St Margaret's for years and who do so much behind the scenes work. To Richard and David, who not only make sure we are warm in church but who faithfully ensure everything runs smoothly and looks great. To Angela and the choir, how wonderful to have you there. To Rob S who played so beautifully and sang. Thank you to those who cleaned and polished the church before the service, it looked lovely.

There should be a shout out to the caterers who were the Salvation Army (the sandwich people) what a fantastic spread at a reasonable cost meaning everyone could enjoy the evening. There were people involved in serving drinks and clearing up and I want to express my deep thanks to you all. June, thank you for the cake what a lovely surprise and also for being involved with food, napkins and everything else.

I know that I have probably missed out people and if that is you, I am truly sorry and hope that you will forgive me.

Seeds have been sown in the potting shed and the results are good, I am at the moment potting on the plants into individual pots and trays in readiness for the plant sales in May.


It has been an interesting spring to grow plants, trying to maintain the heat and not having it too warm so that the plants remain strong.

Book Review -- The Memory Keeper of Kyiv by Erin Litteken

I wanted to find out more about the background to Ukraine and Russia's history in Ukraine and saw this book advertised

The book tells the history of Stalin's Activists marching across the Soviet Union in the 1930's transporting Ukrainian, taking over farms and creating a man-made famine which stole almost 4 million lives. The Second World War and Hitler's invasion of Poland and Ukraine added a second blow and after the war the man-made famine was kept quiet as Russia was on Europe's side.

Erin Littekin is a descendant of a Ukrainian family living in USA and reimagines their story in Ukraine. It tells how Katya a 16 year old in 1929, surrounded by her family and in love with the boy next door. When Stalin's Activists arrive in their village and neighbours start to disappear never to be seen again.


The book also tells of a family in USA of Ukrainian descendants who struggle with trying to translate the diary of their Great Grandmother, who lived through the famine and kept a diary of that time.

It is an interesting insight into Ukrainian life and tearful at times. Switching from Ukraine 1929 to USA 2004 after every chapter which lightens the read and is a powerful testament to Ukrainians not wanting to be annexed by Russia.

I have put the book in the St Margaret's Centre entrance hall book swap cupboard, please look out for it.

There is a second book being written telling a second part of the family during the Second World War. I hope to buy this when it comes out so look out for Erin Littekin.




Bumps and Babes St Margaret's Swindon
