Down country lanes and tracks

St Cuthbert's Chapel Inner Farne Islands

A few years ago we had a holiday in Northumbria staying in Seahouses right on the harbour front 'where the boats come in' I had to write that. We visited the many lovely castles and gardens whilst there, one of the most interesting places was Lindisfarne island and the history of St Cuthbert who carried on the Celtic tradition. One of the most striking statues is of St Aidan in St Mary's Churchyard on the Holy Island of Lindisfarne.

I wanted to tell you of our trip by boat from the harbour of Seahouses by the famous Billy Shiels boat to travel 2 miles out to the inner Farne Island where St Aidan found solitude away from the hustle and bustle of Lindisfarne where the Iona Community had a Monastic settlement.

St Aidan who was bishop of Lindisfarne made his way to Inner Farne in 640 to set up a small cell type dwelling. St Cuthbert who was a former shepherd boy who had become Prior of Lindisfarne repeated the retreat in 676 but his time was needed to oversee the Community and after becoming Bishop in his later life returned to the cell only to die in 687.



The Cell was famous due to the two Celtic saints and a chapel was built beside the site in the 14th Century dedicated to St Cuthbert. The Chapel was much restored in the 1800's with alterations and improvements. A stain glass window was added by Gateshead Artist-Glazier William Wailes in 1844 and an abundance of darkwood panelling makes for a gloomy appearance. Archdeacon Thorp took it on as a challenge to brighten up the chapel and fill it with items from Durham Cathedral but added Gothic stalls which rendered the chapel claustrophobic.

It certainly was not what St Cuthberts would have wanted after all he had built a simple cell with enough room for one.

Today you can visit St Cuthbert's Chapel which is run by the National Trust from April to October and there is now a visitors' centre close by. Every year a few services are held by visiting Christian Groups.

PROPHESY

Reading Mark in the New Testament we see that he commences by saying that John would prepare the way for Jesus, as foretold in Isaiah some 700 years previously.

To our modern minds this may seem almost too good to be true but it is undeniably that it was and still is enshrined in Isaiah's written statement. Again, Malaki chapter 3 verse 1 foretold the coming of John. 'The Lord Almighty says I will send my messenger.....'.

This was written around 400 BC, again in modern eyes an amazingly accurate prophesy. Since the Bible is of a long ago age, it is dificult on occasions, to understand the context and times in which it was written.

Suffice it to say though, if we take the trouble to refer back to the times of the Old Testament prophets, it surely

corroborates Christian belief that Jesus surely was, is and always will be the Son of God, on which our faith and beliefs are founded.



FAITH CAN MOVE MOUNTAINS

In Matthew, Jesus talks of having sufficient faith to move mountains.

I am satisfied that my humble and limited faith has always been answered for me, perhaps not with what I wanted but, much more importantly, by what I did in fact unknowingly need. Volunteer Transport Groups Information Sheet



Community First

Community First is a registered charity (288117) based in Devizes that offers practical support and guidance for Link (volunteer car) Schemes and Community Minibus Groups in Wiltshire. These volunteer transport groups offer a vital lifeline to local facilities and medical care for vulnerable and isolated people across the county who do not have access to public or private transport. We are working with local volunteer transport groups as part of a new campaign to find volunteers to support the service and help meet growing demand.

Link Schemes

A Link Scheme is a volunteer-led service which offers door-to-door transport for people who are unable to access public or private transport. Link Schemes offer transport for medical appointments, trips to local shops and lunch clubs. Each Link Scheme covers a specific geographic area e.g. a group of villages, with volunteers offering transport in their own vehicles to local towns and medical appointments at nearby hospitals and doctors surgeries.

Community Minibus Groups

A Community Minibus Group offers group transport for people who need help to get out and about. These may be elderly people or people who live in areas not covered by public transport. Community Minibus groups may make regular group trips from a specific location e.g. a group of villages to local shops or facilities (similar to a shuttle bus). Community Minibus Groups may also offer day trips and outings to reduce isolation and help people stay independent and active.

Link Schemes and Community Minibus Groups rely on donations from clients and the support of volunteer drivers, co-ordinators and committee members to operate the service for local people.

How local transport volunteers make a difference:

There are over 1,500 volunteers in Wiltshire and Swindon who are involved in supporting Link Schemes locally, either as volunteer drivers, coordinators or committee members. Last year volunteer drivers travelled over 750,000 miles, taking people to local hospitals, doctors appointments, shops and lunch clubs. Without the transport offered by Link Schemes and Community Minibus Groups, many of the people who use these services would find it hard to leave their home, leading to isolation and declining mental or physical health.

The service offered by volunteer transport groups can be truly life-changing, offering peace of mind, dignity and the opportunity to lead a normal, independent life. Volunteering with your local transport service is a fantastic way to make a real difference.
