

Dear Church Family

I thought I would take the opportunity this month to give you an update on how my Lent disciplines are going with some reflections.

As many of you will know I am wearing the same dress for 100 days, obviously this challenge extends past Lent but I thought I would use Ash Wednesday as a springboard. The ethos behind the brand is to be ethically sustainable and fair trade. The purpose of the 100 day challenge is to reduce the spotlight effect (you can look this up). The idea being that most people don't notice or care what you wear unless they've specifically mentioned a dress code on an invitation. Additionally, the same dress reduces decision fatigue each morning. The material being wool doesn't retain odours so reducing the need to frequently wash it. I must stress at this point I do wash it, every 10 days or so and spot wash when necessary. All of this felt appropriate and in line with Lent and our church's eco vision.

So how am I doing? Well the dress is holding up nicely, it can be washed and dried overnight and I quite like it even though I am used to wearing trousers/ jeans more often than dresses. It's comfortable and versatile though, I am what they call 'team basic' in that I'm not that inventive when it comes to styling. A cardigan or jumper over the top or cotton top underneath is about as creative I've been so far. There's been quite a lot of interest generated by me posting about this challenge daily on Facebook and if you do follow either our Stratton Team Group or me personally please do give it a 'like' it's encouraging to me and helps our team algorithms on Facebook. I have tried to make some of the photos a little interesting rather than just me posing in front of my door so I hope you're not too bored of me. My intention is to create a sponsor page where if you would like to you can donate and this money will go to an eco charity (yet to be decided hence page not yet set up).

Along with the daily picture I have also written one thing I am grateful for, this is to frame my thoughts on the positives and will hopefully encourage you too, to find just one thing each day that gives you a sense of gratitude.

What hasn't yet gone quite so well is the decluttering side of things. I was hoping to pick one area in the house or storage space to go through and either sell, give away or donate anything I no longer need or use. I would like to say that time has been the only reason as to why I have not yet done anything however energy and enthusiasm have also been lacking. But there are now two motivators coming up for me, one is my slimming world group collecting for Cancer Research items they can re-sell in their shops and at church, we are doing our Rags to Riches collecting which will take anything on 14th October which may feel like a long way off but worth bearing in mind. This decluttering is meant to be only for Lent but I hope I might get into a habit of regularly clearing out what I no longer need or use, some people hold the principle of one in, one out but I'm not sure I'm quite ready for that yet!

What is the purpose of what may seem an unorthodox Lent observation? Well Lent is all about creating space to let God in. Anything that creates that space in my opinion is worth trying. Traditional fasting from food and using meal times to instead of eating to pray are not always easy to observe although our Muslim communities seem to be able to fit Ramadan in so maybe we're just too soft?

Whatever you have decided to do for Lent I hope it is going well and that you are finding some quality and quantity time with God.
