Down country lanes and tracks

A few years ago I came across the church of St Enodoc's on a walk from Rock in Cornwall, setting off from Padstow across the Camel Estuary in a yellow passenger ferry to Daymar beach. You can find the church by walking through St Enodoc's golf course to the tenth hole - but watch out for golf balls and golfers.

St Enodoc's church has a strange history. It is said to be built on the site of a cave where St Enodoc lived. He could have come from Wales and settled there. The church was started to be built in the 12th century with additions over the next 3 centuries. During 1822 several large storms buried the church with sand and the local vicar at the time had to be lowered down through a roof light to bless the church so it remained consecrated. The sand was dug out and the church cleaned during 1863-64 and restoration was carried out by J.P. St Aubyn.

The golf course was added surrounding the church in 1890.

The most famous family that worshiped there was the Betjeman family who lived at Trebetherick including Sir John Betjeman who wrote a poem about the church and helped to add to the fame of St Enodoc's. He also bought a house in Treen in Daymar Lane in 1959 opposite the 12th Hole of the golf course and following his death in 1984 was buried in the churchyard.

As you reach the church across the golf course and see the church in a hollow with low walls below the surrounding ground level, you can imagine how it could have been buried by sand.

The poem Sir John Betjemen wrote immortalised the church

'Sunday Afternoon Service in St Enodoc Church Cornwall'

So if you're down that way in Padstow, Port Issac or Wadebridge take a walk down from Rock before there is another great storm.
